ABOUT THE COLLEGE

SARAIGHAT COLLEGE is one of the premier higher Educational Institutions in greater Changsari area of Kamrup (Rural) District, Assam. It is situated near the National Highway (NH-31). The college is well connected with other major parts of the region. Since its inception, the college has been working with a missionary zeal to promote higher education amongst the rural population of the area with special emphasis on the socio-economically marginalized sections of the society. In its relentless service, the institution has so far experienced various hazards and challenges but has successfully managed to overcome them.

Established on 21st July, 1981 with 116 students, 8 teachers and 2 non- teaching staff, Saraighat College is currently providing higher education to nearly 1600 students with a strength of 30 permanent faculties and 10 non- teaching staff. The institution was brought under the deficit Grant-in-Aid system and the Government provincialized status under the Assam State Government on 25th March 1998 and1st January 2006 respectively. It was placed under the 2(f) category on 28-10-2008 and 12-B category on 13-4-2009 by the University Grants Commission (UGC). Accredited B –GRADE (CYCLE-II) by NAAC in 2015, the college offers Higher Secondary Course under the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council (AHSEC) and Bachelor of Arts Courses (Honours & Regular) across 11 disciplines affiliated to Gauhati University (GU). From 2017 onwards, the college has also started a three years Bachelors of Vocational Course in Travel and Tourism Management (B.VOC under GU).

The college was established with a vision to bring Higher Education closer to the people to make it accessible to the underprivileged sections of the society. It seeks to open new vistas of opportunities to the future generation through the spread of knowledge. The children of today are the leaders of tomorrow. The College therefore envisions making its students explore their innate potentialities through knowledge and become the change that they wish to see in their society. INSTITUTIONAL WEAKNESS.

- Inadequate number of permanent faculty.
- More ICT enabled classrooms required.
- Insufficient Land for campus expansion.
- Lack of Auditorium, Boys hostel.
- Lack of well-equipped playground.
- Scope of Self-Resource Mobilization is limited.
- Multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary approach under NEP2020 cannot be implemented if commerce and science steams are not introduced by the Government.

INSTITUTIONAL OPPORTUNITY

- College seeks to introduce some more vocational and skill-based courses to generate employability.
- To introduce Add on courses and other Post-Graduation courses to make students confident and knowledgeable for getting placed.
- NCC and NSS wings of the college are actively involved in many programs related to nation building and social service. Can be offered as an optional course in the UG curriculum.
- Sports activity of the students can be improved by appointing coaches.
- Scope for introducing Commerce and Science stream.
- Scope for constructing multi-storied RCC building by dismantling the existing Assam type building.
- Clustering with neighboring colleges for credit transfer and student-faculty exchange

INSTITUTIONAL CHALLENGES

- A huge portion of resources in the form of fund, manpower and infrastructure will be required to convert the college from single stream into a multi-disciplinary institute.
- Being a single stream college, proper implementation of NEP 2020 guidelines will be a big challenge for the college in days to come.
- Lack of sufficient number of teaching faculties in most of the departments pose challenge in the academic sphere.
- Unavailability of playground and auditorium pose challenge in managing co-curricular activities
 of the student.
- Managing fund for academic, co-curricular and extension activities is a major challenge as the college has to appoint contractual teaching faculties for most of the department.
- As the physical space of the college is limited, future expansion of the college faces a big challenge. The college authority has already approached the Chief Minister, Assam for allocation of government land.
- Often the students coming from vernacular background lack proper communication skill.
- Unemployment has become the threat to the traditional learning without having practical exposure in the curriculum.
- The full potential of alumni is yet to be tapped so far as more developmental work is concerned.
- The college needs to introduce more skill-oriented program to cater to the social needs.
- Implementation of NEP 2020.

1. SHORT-TERM GOALS (FOR NEXT FIVE YEARS)

- To introduce more vocational, add on and certificate courses to make education accessible to all and to engage women students from rural areas and less privileged sections of the society.
- Opening-up of Integrated B.Ed. course.
- To provide placement opportunities for promoting employment.

- To enhance ICT enabled class room in each department '
- Creating a strong academic culture with high student- faculty ratio.

ACTION PLAN TO REALIZE SHORT-TERM STRATEGIC GOALS ON DIFFERENT ASPECTS

CURRICULAR ASPECTS

OBJECTIVE

- To promote and comprehend Indian Knowledge system by introducing Add-on courses in multidisciplinary aspects.
- Facilitating the students to get exposure to important place, people and ethnicity through field trips to acquire important inputs about socio-cultural, economic and scientific development in our society.
- Different aspects of our tradition and Indian knowledge system to be imparted.
- Students to be prepared as skilled participants in creative programs related to writing, art, sculpture, painting and film making.
- Employability of the students to be increased and programs related to job fair, counselling for recruitment organized.

STRATEGY

- Value added result-oriented education (Outcome Based Education) will be imparted and students will find the difference comparing their exit position with the entry one.
- Formalities of opening-up of the Integrated B.Ed. course are going on. It will help students absorb in the demanding educational sector.
- Existing Rabin Dev Choudhury Centre for Visual Arts of Saraighat College to be made fully functional with Add-on courses related to arts, crafts and photography/film-making. Language departments of the institution will conduct and organize workshops on creative writing in regular interval of time.
- Design, compile and publish study materials for the restructured and newly introduced Add on courses.
- Give importance to placement activities by conducting job fairs and hosting Recruitment drives.

TEACHING, LEARNING AND EVALUATION

OBJECTIVE

- Regular visit to the adopted villages and to guide and participate in the process of resolving local issues.
- The institute will give travelling allowance to the faculty members to their visit to outstation institutions for presentation of research papers.
- Feeder schools will be continuously monitored and assisted by the faculty members in overcoming pedagogical problems to the maximum possible extent.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

- Beautification of the college garden and green initiatives will be conducted in a more systematic manner.
- Provision of hostel facility to be improved and capacity of seats to be increased.

ACTION PLAN TO REALIZE LONG-TERM STRATEGIC GOALS ON DIFFERENT ASPECTS AS PER GUIDELINES OF NEP-2020

1. Making the institute a true Multi-Disciplinary and Inter-Disciplinary Centre of excellence: To achieve this goal the institute is planning to open Bachelor of Science (B. Sc) and Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com) programs.

Post Graduate Programs will be introduced and Courses in Management will also be introduced.

2. Facilitating Academic Bank of Credit (ABC):

In phased manner, M.O.U.s will be signed up with different educational institutions of our country and abroad to practically create a system of Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) as per guidelines of NEP. The institution will take required technical support for creation of ABC from capable agencies of government and non-government agencies to store and transfer credits across the institutions.

3. Making the Institute a Centre of Skill based courses:

The institution will introduce skill based courses to its existing programs. Under the CBCS curriculum Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) have already been introduced in the B.A. and B.VOC. Programs. In addition to these courses, the college will introduce new Professional and Management courses for the benefit of Graduation Level students. Already, the process of introducing Integrated B.Ed. program is going on.

New courses on Visual Arts, Sports and Physical Fitness and Music will also be introduced in phased manner. With these introductions the students will get opportunity to select courses of their choice during their Graduation and Post-Graduation studies.

4. Appropriate Integration of Indian Knowledge System:

Classical Indian Literature, Indian Political and Social Systems, Ancient Indian Philosophical Thoughts and Historical Developments have been already incorporated in the ongoing programs and courses. Courses like Yoga and Meditation, Traditional Massage-Remedies, Sanskrit will be introduced in full fledge manner.

Already, Spoken-Sanskrit has been introduced in this institution. Effort is on to offer courses in blended modes and online course modules for all the offered courses will be designed in phased manner. In the curriculum delivery mechanism Bi-Lingual approach has been already in use. In the coming years, with this described approach, the institution will be a proper place of where both modern and traditional knowledge will be ready for the students in synthesized form and teaching modules.

5. Stress on Outcome Based Education (OBE)

Equipped with an approach to introduce new Skill Enhancement Courses, the institute will engage all its physical and human resources to offer Outcome Based Education (OBE) to its students. Programs like Integrated B.Ed., Commerce, Science and Social Science have full potential to cater productive careers for the students of Graduate and Post-Graduate Levels. Introduction of the new Programs and Courses to attain this goal in the coming years in phased manner will make the institution a Centre of Multi-Disciplinary and Outcome Based Education on the Northern Bank of River Brahmaputra in central Assam.

6. Making the Institution a Centre of Distance Learning:

The Institution will prepare its own Online Learning Module and study material as per guideline of the NEP-2020 to facilitate the system of distance learning. It is in the process of planning to execute technical aspects for the creation of a platform for this end. At present, the institution offers facility of distance education in collaboration with the Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University (KKHSOU). Preparation of institutional Program and Course materials for Distance Learning will help the students with flexibility in the process of learning.

7. Fund Generation and Economic Development

The institution has already formed a special committee to deal with the process of Resource-Mobilization, Fund-Generation and Economic-Development. It is formed to find out alternative ways of financial management, cost reduction and revenue generation.

Detailed programs will be prepared for sustainable development of the institution with technical experts and proposals for fund will be submitted to the concerned agencies of state and union governments; international organizations and universities.

MoUs will be signed up for new start-up involving students with competent authorities of government and non-government entities.
